



Comp 170 Participation Assignment – What We Learned (Learning Outcomes)

As in the course syllabus, late assignments will not be accepted unless you have completed the process for using a late pass before the due date.

Work with your assigned group, team, or Harkness Table. I submission for the whole group. Reflect on what you are taking away from the class; what you have learned; what you can relate to.

1. Submit

Online in Sakai before the due date. You can *save* files in the Sakai assignment as often as you wish (and remove them or update them), but you can only submit *once* before the due date.

One person submit for the whole team. Also put your file in the forum for others to see.

Each topic in the document lists the name(s) of the team members who wrote it.

2. Content

Agree with your group on the top ten "things" you learned in class; pick those most important to the whole group. You must have TEN.

Each one can be a concept, a tool, a way of working, or just about anything else you and your group feel was an important learning in the course. Give each one a short name.

Once you have ten, assign one or more team members to write up the concept. The write up should explain why it is important in at least 2 or three sentences. The write up for the concept will end with the name(s) of those who did the write up.

After all have written their assigned topic(s), the whole group will review, improve, and approve the final list.

The goal is to have a nicely written, complete, well-structured document that shows what you believe were the most important things learned in class.

3. Grading

20 points total; -5 points for not having exactly 10 topics; -5 points for having excessive duplication between topics; -5 points for not listing the authors for each point; -5 for really bad composition, spelling, grammar, etc.
